Hi everybody from the wet North!

This week a huge well done must go to our fantastic Year 3 and 4 children for approaching their residential to **East Barnby** with such enthusiasm and determination. Despite the sunshine that we ordered not being delivered, they had an amazing time and represented the school brilliantly well.

As you may already know, the Government have stipulated that schools need to either provide **wraparound care** until 6pm or be able to signpost parents to this. Although extending the school day until 6pm may seem a simple task, it's not quite so simple. It relies on staff being willing to change their current contracts and stay longer -which means additional pay to be funded- and also means that a second adult in school (which we are advised to have for Health and Safety reasons) will also need to stay until this time. Some schools are going to employ outside companies to negate these issues, but these companies demand a minimum number of pupils which we are unlikely to fulfil given our size. This is further complicated by the fact that our before and after-school Buddies actually runs at a loss each year, something affected by the fact that we don't charge for any of our after-school clubs – often at the detriment to Buddies as many children might have attended that anyway. After half term I would like to gather your views and ideas on some of these things as we plan ahead to next year.

Given the development of Wild School, the other improvements made to the curriculum, and the fact that nature is one of our school Pillars, we have begun the process of rebranding the school. You can already see the start of this process around school and our website will also soon be changed. One possibility is that we change the colour of our **school uniform** to green – to better reflect our ethos and nature Pillar. There is lots of recent government guidance regarding how schools must provide the very best value for parents with regards to uniform, as well as making this as easy to access and affordable as possible, so reviewing our uniform and developing an agreed policy with you all is timely. Again, we will be seeking your thoughts and ideas regarding this after half term, to shape what we do in future.

I thought that you would appreciate seeing an email which I received from NYCC on Tuesday, regarding Penalty Notices and the significant increase in these. As you know, our attendance has dipped hugely this term – something which has been mirrored in other parts of the county. As a school, we haven't requested any penalty notices at all up to this point, preferring instead to work alongside families to help attendances improve. Similarly, we haven't followed the 'notice to improve' process and formal meetings outlined in the document below – again because I prefer to work in partnership with families. We are however coming under increasing and sustained pressure to follow these guidelines, hence my constant reference to keeping attendance high if at all possible:

"As you are aware there have been some significant changes to the DfE statutory guidance <u>Working</u> together to improve school attendance (applies from 19 August 2024) (publishing.service.gov.uk) around the use of Fixed Penalty Notices which apply from the 19th of August 2024. In order for the North Yorkshire Council to comply with the requirements of the guidance, we have amended our Code of Conduct for the use of Fixed Penalty Notices as follows:





Penalty Notices for unauthorised leave of absence taken in term time:

From the 19th of August 2024 only 2 Penalty Notices can be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within a 3-year rolling period and any 2nd Penalty Notice issued within that period is charged at a higher rate:

- The first Fixed Penalty Notice issued to a parent in respect of a particular child will be charged at £160 if paid within 28 days, this will be reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.
- A second Fixed Penalty Notice issued to the same parent in respect of the same child will be charged a flat rate of £160 if paid within 28 days.
- A third Fixed Penalty Notice cannot be issued to the same parent in respect of the same child within 3 years of the date of issue of the first Penalty Notice.
- In a case where the national threshold is met for the third time (or subsequent times) alternative action should be taken instead. This will often include considering Prosecution but may include other tools such as one of the other Attendance Legal Interventions.

Schools are also able to contact the LA to request the issue of a Penalty Notice if there have been at least 10 sessions of unauthorised absence, in a block or accumulated, in the preceding 10-week period. In cases where a pupil has moved school or Local Authority area in the previous 3 years, an additional check should be made by school to try to ascertain whether previous Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued to the parent in respect of the pupil. To reduce any unnecessary workload, North Yorkshire Council has established a mailbox to allow queries from other local authorities and vice versa. Where possible, local authorities should use crossborder.penaltynotice@northyorks.gov.uk to make it as easy as possible.

Penalty Notices for long term poor attendance:

Fixed Penalty Notices can be issued as an outcome of a PACE Formal Caution interview. In those instances, a Notice to Improve will have been sent to the parent. This replaces the current 15 Day Fixed Penalty Notice Warning letter.

Fixed Penalty Notices issued for long term poor attendance cases are included in the national framework and therefore do count towards the limit as part of the escalation process in the case of repeat offences for non attendance.

Penalty Notices for being found in a public place within the first 5 days of a Suspension:

Fixed Penalty Notices issued for being found in a public place within the first 5 days of a Suspension are not included in the national framework and therefore do not count towards the limit as part of the escalation process.

Regardless, we will continue to do whatever we can to support you and your child's attendance. If I can help in any way, please let me know.

Safeguarding

Should you have any **Safeguarding** concerns, please report these to Mr Robinson (Designated Safeguarding Lead) or Mrs Davis (Deputy Safeguarding Lead) in his absence. 
The Summer Fair – Tuesday 11th June

This week's attendance




The government expectation for all schools is 96%+ attendance.
