Hi everybody,

We are always keen to bring learning to life here at Brompton and Sawdon and this had been encapsulated nicely in Class 2 this week as they have continued their Ring of Fire topic – all about volcanoes, rocks and soils. One important element of this is fossils – something that you simply can't learn about by looking at pictures in a text book. The Class 2 children therefore visited the Rotunda Museum to have hands-on fossil workshops, followed the next day by a visiting speaker who shared her collection and experiences with the class. This will be further enhanced through fossil hunting sessions on the East Barnby residential later in the year.

Well done to all of the children who went swimming yesterday, following the broken pool boiler last week! It's great to hear that everybody tried really hard, even if some children were a little nervous with it being their first session. Now that all of the children have been assessed, lessons will start next week.

It's always important that we work closely with other schools in order for us to judge the effectiveness what we are doing. This week, we attended a meeting of many local schools to share the children's writing books and moderate our judgements. These meetings continue through the year. In fact, the process of adapting and enhancing our curriculum is an ongoing one. In the background we are currently auditing all of the subject plans to ensure that, as well as covering the individual subjects in depth, they also include, consider and cover those key areas of Diversity, Rural Aspirations and Global Awareness. For example, the Science curriculum contains lifecycles, habitats and evolution and we are able to link these to current environmental issues locally and globally – hopefully developing a sense of responsibility as well as a good understanding of current issues. Similarly, within the History curriculum we explore why the skeletons found at Hadrian's Wall are incredibly diverse and originate from many different places, allowing the children to further develop an understanding of migration and society. Linking knowledge is the key to them remembering it.

Once again, apologies for the late cancellation of My Happy Mind Club on Tuesday. We were only informed at 12:50pm by the Counsellors that they could no longer do it. This is due to their limited, funded time and the desire to see as many children individually as possible.

Please call the school office to book your place and confirm who will be coming. There will be a small charge of £3.45 per adult, siblings will be free.

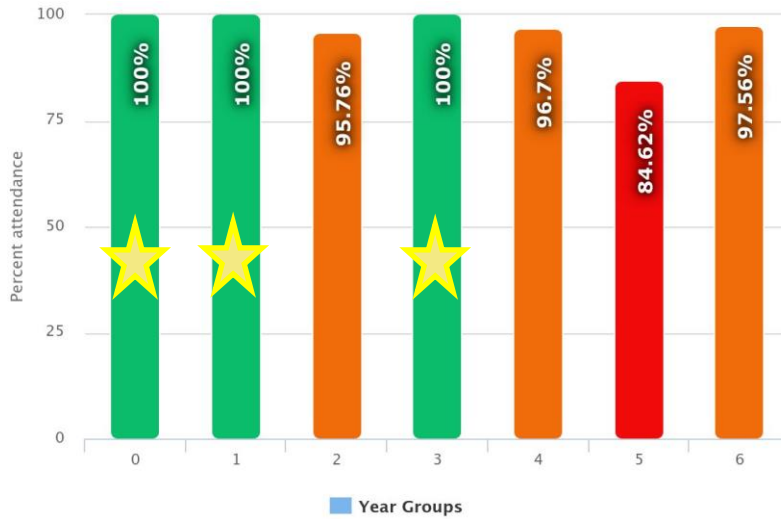
