Hi everybody,

It's another well done to our sports teams to start the newsletter this week – our **Netball** and **Cricket** teams both represented the school brilliantly in their events this week. Although we are a small school, I am keen that we give the children as many opportunities as possible to represent the school at, or simply experience and enjoy, as many different sporting fixtures and events as we can. Obviously, we are a small staff and so this can mean that other activities might change on that particular week – we will try to minimise this but bear in mind that we don't decide on when the fixtures are.

The school grounds will soon start to look quite different. I'm sure the children will be excited to hear that we will soon be getting a new **garden room** for the Class 1 outdoor area, as well as a new **ball court** once this is in place. As the children start their journey with us in Reception, we are also keen to further revamp this area – reflecting our Wild School ethos. These will give us much needed additional learning and play areas.

The children will be completing their **Spring Term Assessments** over the next couple of weeks. These are a useful tool in allowing us to see how individuals, groups and classes have progressed from term to term, or those where we need to adapt what we do, or offer a little more support. We use standardised, nationwide tests for this, the results of which we will be able to share with you at the **Parent Consultation Meetings** in a couple of weeks. We actually assess the children all of the time, using a whole range of methods. These range from looking at the children's work, to discussions, to quizzes and questioning, to name but a few. All of these are vital in helping us to identify who might need to be challenged or who might need a little more support on a lesson by lesson basis.

If you haven't done so already, please contact Mrs New in the school office to arrange a time/day for your **Parent Consultation Meeting** with your child/ren's class teacher/s. These are a really useful time for us to share how they are getting on in school and let you know how they fared in the recent assessments. As always however, if you have any questions or concerns, please don't hesitate to come and see us at any time. You will always be most welcome and your questions or concerns valued.

Please call the school office to book your place and confirm who will be coming. There will be a small charge of £3.45 per adult, siblings will be free.

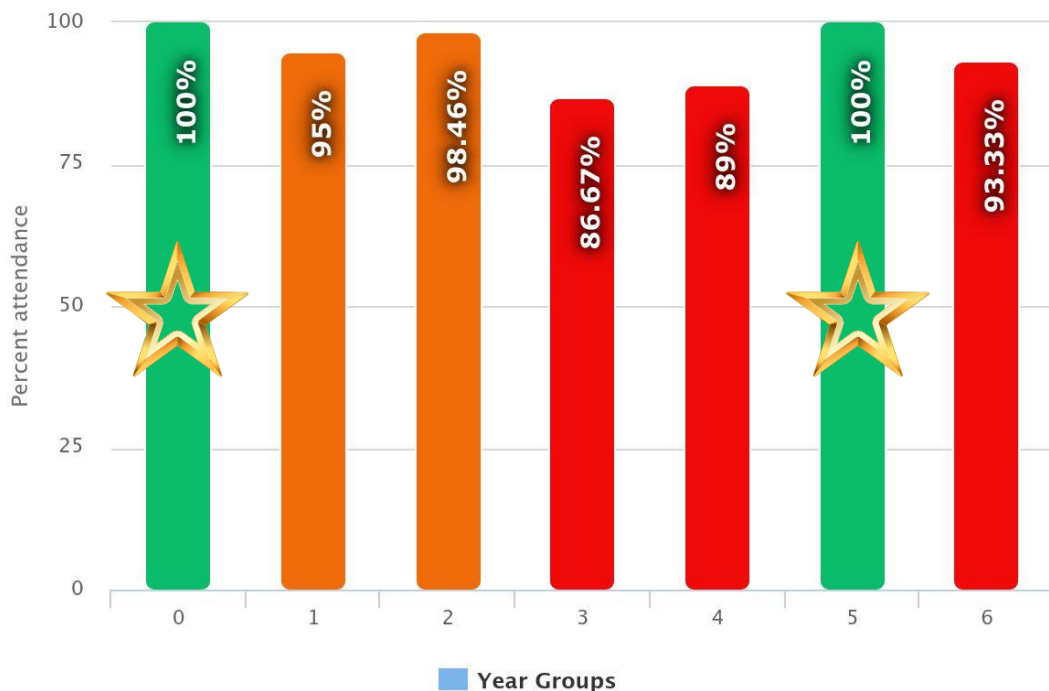

This week's attendance

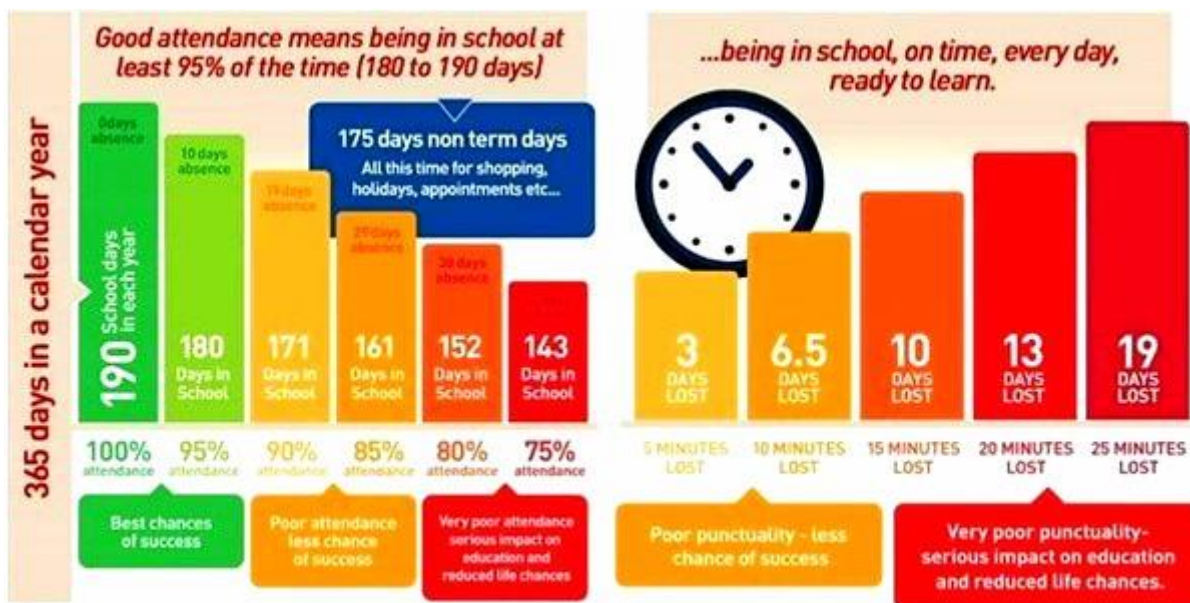


The government expectation for all schools is **96%+** attendance.

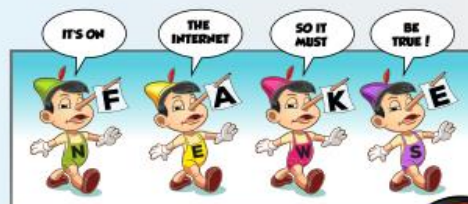
