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Hi everybody,

As we approach the last week of the school year, it is a good time to reflect on what we, as a school community, have achieved this year...

I'm pleased to say that we have managed to continue to give the children the widest range of different experiences, visitors, residentials and visits, all designed to broaden their experiences, give them chances to try something new, help them remember key bits of knowledge – and have fun at the same time! This range of experiences could not have happened without the AMAZING work of the Friends of the School. On behalf of the children, staff and parents can I say a huge thank you for this. It is hugely appreciated by us all. This week the children have enjoyed Olympic Dance workshops and the Class 3 Summer Production.

Our **Curriculum** has improved even more. As Ofsted found, it was already ambitious and thorough, however we felt that we could improve it further to tackle some of those areas which we know we have to worker harder on in our school – the children's knowledge of **Diversity**, their **Global knowledge** and their **awareness of the countless possibilities and technologies that the world can offer**. These now shine through every subject.

We've welcomed **three new fantastic members of staff** into the school family – Mrs New, Miss Bocutt and, in September – Mrs Newcombe.

We've introduced a **new synthetic phonic scheme (Little Wandle**) which has already helped the children learn to spell, read and write at an increased pace and earlier age. It's also been brilliant to see you support this through the **spelling and reading practice that you have done at home with the children**— it really does make a huge difference. Equally, it's been lovely to see so many of you at the regular **Read With Me** Sessions.

From January we really concentrated on **refining the way in which we teach maths**, using the White Rose maths scheme. You will now see far more discussion and collaboration during maths sessions, as well as teachers adapting the resources more to meet group needs. We also introduced **daily fluency sessions** from Reception, in order to develop the children's foundations in maths knowledge and ability to recall key multiplication facts quickly- the latter being something which we need to continue to get better at.

A curriculum is only successful if the children can remember what they have been taught – not the week after or at the end of the unit, but long term. To do this they need to revisit past learning lots. To facilitate this, and allow the teachers to see who might not remember certain knowledge, we have developed and introduced or own **bespoke assessment system**, used at the start of each lesson to make the children retrieve past learning and develop long term memory of it.

The appearance of the school has continued to improve. We now have the Garden Room in Class 1 which is already proving hugely beneficial in teaching different groups. This week we have also installed a new sensory room, which children can access to calm down and regulate. We are increasingly reflecting our Nature Pillar in every classroom, creating that calmest, positive atmosphere that we can. I must also say a huge thank you to Cayley's Cuttings (our gardening club) for the amazing impact that they have had in the front garden. Thanks to their hard work at lunchtimes, this is now bigger, more colourful and useable then it









has ever been. It looks amazing and is so lovely to see as you come into school. If you haven't had chance yet, have a look for yourselves! Very soon the ball court will be created, giving our sporty children a better space to play and practice.

We have also created and launched **Wild School** – the first in North Yorkshire! We really want the children to have the knowledge, skills and confidence to make a real difference in the future – at a local and global scale. Protecting the environment is central to a positive future and we want our children to really embrace that, caring for everything in it. Behind the scenes, we are reflecting our **Wild School ethos** more and more in school. For example, **automatic lights** will soon be installed throughout the school which will only operate if somebody is in a room and we are increasingly looking to use **renewable or recycled resources**. The bird feeding stations, which have proved so popular with those passing the school, will be operational again in September. We are so thankful to **Wydale Hall** for their support and generosity with this.

To reflect our ever-improving offer for the children we have also **rebranded** the school. Our **new logo** references the history of the school and village, at the same time reflecting the notion that from tiny acorns grow huge oak trees. Our new strapline of **Reach Higher, See Further** is again a nod to the ingenuity and tenacity of Cayley. It also reflects the fact that we want every child to do their very best and look further, far further, to see and consider the impact and influence beyond themselves at a local and global scale.

Our uniform change is also nearing completion. Thank you for you views and ideas regarding this. Thank you also for your patience and understanding. Although it's always a huge change for any school, our smart new uniforms will further strengthen our links with Wild School and our Nature Pillar. Next week we will have different sizes in school for the children to try on, should you wish to purchase anything at this point. I am already speaking to sports kit providers to make sure that our **sports teams** feel equally proud of the school kits!

We even found time to achieve the **Gold Games Mark** for our involvement and promotion of PE and sport, as well as our involvement in as many fixtures as possible. I'm particularly proud of this as we have relatively few children to fill the teams yet they always approach every match with such enthusiasm, resilience and support for each other. We'll continue this sporting approach next year.

All of the above will be reflected in our new Website, currently being developed behind the scenes. I'm sure that you will love it!

As you know, I think that our children should be taught out of the classroom as much as possible. There are endless possibilities and opportunities on our doorstep in the surrounding countryside to do this and make learning memorable. For example, if we are studying landscapes in art, you need to be out in the landscape to paint one. If you are studying rivers, you need to experience and explore the features of a real river to remember them. If you are studying plants, you need to be able to explore, discover different plants in different habitats to understand how the different parts of them work. Thanks to an incredible donation, we will shortly be purchasing a minibus for the school, meaning that the children can do the above and so much more. Suddenly, so many barriers to learning and experiences beyond the classroom have been lifted and we will soon truly be able to bring our curriculum to life beyond the classroom. I'm looking forward to Wild School clubs! I may be able to tell you more shortly. In the meantime, I know that you will all want me to also pass on your thanks and gratitude.

A visitor recently said to me that it felt like we were creating a 'private education in a state school.' None to of the above would be possible without your support, patience, honesty, ideas and open-ness. I'm extremely grateful for these.

If I don't see you to say it in person at the end of next week, I hope that you have a wonderful (hopefully sunnier!) Summer. Take care,

#### **ANNUAL BUDGETING HELP 2024/2025**


