ParentPay

Please do check your ParentPay accounts regularly. Wraparound care should be paid for at the time of booking (unless you are using childcare vouchers), and after school club places should be paid for on allocation of a place. We still have a number of outstanding balances that need to be cleared. Please get in touch if you have any concerns regarding the clearing of any outstanding balances.

Please can we request that you book all Buddies sessions in advance directly through ParentPay

In order to book please follow the instructions below: Bookings must be made per event type and per child-

- *Early Breakfast Buddies (7.45am 8.40am) £4.00
- *Standard Breakfast Buddies (8.00am 8.40am) £3.00
- *Standard Afternoon Buddies (3.30pm 4.30pm) £3.00
- *Late Afternoon Buddies (3.30pm 5.30pm) £5.00

Cut off times for booking will be 30 minutes before the session starts. Any last minute, emergency bookings can still be made by contacting the school office directly (01723 859359)

Instructions:

- 1. Go to www.parentpay.com and log in
- 2. Select the child you wish to make the booking for
- 3. Select Bookings
- 4. Select Make or View bookings
- 5. Select the time of day that you wish to make a booking for:
 - -Early Breakfast Buddies (7.45am 8.40am) £4.00
 - -Standard Breakfast Buddies (8.00am 8.40am) £3.00
 - -Standard Afternoon Buddies (3.30pm 4.30pm) £3.00
 - -Late Afternoon Buddies (3.30pm 5.30pm) £5.00
- 6. Select the week to view
- 7. Select make or view bookings
- 8. Make the required bookings
- 9. A summary will then be displayed at the bottom of the page with any previous unpaid bookings shown in red.

WARNING: Any bookings must be confirmed and paid for within 2 hours of selecting them. Failure to do so will result in the bookings being automatically cancelled.

- 10. Review the booking summary, and then select Confirm Booking
- 11. Any credit in your Parent Pay account can be used to pay for clubs. Any remaining costs can then be paid in your usual way.

Your child's account must be in credit to make a booking. The session charge will only be deducted once the session has taken place. If a session is booked and there are no funds, you will be sent a ParentPay warning to add funds. If funds are not submitted, the session will automatically get cancelled.

If your child is ill or you wish to change a session on the day it is due to take place, these changes will be made by school and you will not be charged. Please let the office know.

Dear parent/carer

It's now time to apply for a primary school place

As your child approaches the exciting transition to primary school in September 2025, we're here to guide you through the application process and make the experience as smooth as possible.

Applications open on 12 October 2024 and the deadline to apply is 15 January 2025. Please apply in good time to make sure your child gets a place.

Applying couldn't be easier.

The quickest and easiest way to apply for a primary school place is online at www.northyorks.gov.uk/NYC-PRIML

Key Steps for Applying:

- One Application: You only need to submit one application, and this should be done through your Home Local Authority (where you pay your council tax).
- 2. Application Process in North Yorkshire:
- If you live in North Yorkshire, you can list up to five preferred schools.
- Please note that applying to just one school will not improve your chances of getting a
 place there.
- You are free to apply to any school or academy in North Yorkshire or any other Local Authority area. If you wish to apply for a school in another Local Authority area, list it on your application and we will work with them.

3. Helpful Resources:

Before completing the online form, we highly recommend reviewing the important information available on our School Admissions and Transport page: www.northyorks.gov.uk/admissions This guide will answer many of your questions and help you navigate the process.

4. Submitting Your Application:

Once you've submitted your application online, you'll receive an acknowledgment email. Then, on 16 April 2025, National Offer Day, you'll receive another email with a secure link to view your child's school place offer. Be sure to keep your login details safe as you will need them again to access this information.

Recommendations for a Smooth Application Process:

- We strongly encourage you to include your nearest school as one of your preferences.
 Not doing so might result in your child being allocated a place at a school farther away, and you would be responsible for any transport arrangements and costs.

Remember to save all emails and confirmation messages from us in case you need them in the future





As you may be aware your child's school has a milk scheme, administered by Cool Milk. Midmorning milk provides a much-needed nutritional boost and keeps children hydrated between breakfast and lunch. Children receive free milk until the age of 5. After that, they can continue to reap the benefits of fresh mid-morning milk at a subsidised* cost.

If you'd like to opt in and have not already done so, simply register your child at www.coolmilk.com/register. Your child(ren) will continue to receive free milk whilst under the age of 5 and Cool Milk will get in touch with further information by email shortly before their 5th birthday.

For children who are already over 5, it's not too late – our scheme is flexible! As well as being able to register and make payment straight away, you can join and cancel the scheme at any time. We offer yearly, termly and half termly payment periods and a recurring payment option to give you one less thing to remember.
